Chemists Without Borders has the following open positions:

1. **Communications Officer.** This Officer is responsible for executing communications campaigns with donors, members, partners and employees, and is also responsible for managing communications resources such as advertising, publications and press releases.
2. **Development Officer.** This Officer is responsible for identifying, developing, and managing strategic relationships with a portfolio of individual, foundation and corporate donors.
